## ASK NOT WHAT YOUR COMMUNITY CAN DO FOR YOU – BUT WHAT YOU CAN DO FOR YOUR COMMUNITY

As we are about to launch **COMMUNITY ALERT** in the Skryne/Rathfeigh area the initial aims are as follows:

- 1. To identify the older and vulnerable people within the designated area.
- 2. To focus on the needs and address those needs to improve the quality of life for those who are vulnerable by giving them advice and guidance, involving them in crime prevention measures and on security procedures.
- 3. Raising the level of alertness of everyone in the community, especially the elderly themselves, to any people or vehicles acting suspiciously and taking steps to inform the local Gardai.
- 4. To be aware of the grants available, in particular those to improve the security of older people.

### A Spirit of Neighbourliness

What began as a response to attacks on elderly people in 1984 and 1985 has now led to a revival of the spirit of neighbourliness. Community alert is a nationwide campaign designed to operate in the rural parts of Ireland. The most important element in Community Alert is that local people become more aware of the need to preserve the quality of life of those who are vulnerable in their community by participating in the scheme.

As you know, the Skryne Community Alert Group was set up this Summer. To initiate our project, it will be necessary for us to raise some funds. It is with this in mind, we are notifying you in the hope that you will give this favourable consideration. Members of the local group will be in contact with you in the near future to discuss this and other relevant matters.

As always, if you have any ideas as to how this project can be assisted please do not hesitate to contact your local group.


