The best year so far in the 19 year history of Tara AFC ended in heartbreak yet again when outright honours eluded us. For the first time to have led the league from the start last August to the final game of the season at the end of April is all the more difficult to take - especially when we analyse overall performance. If you check the League Table you will see that we won more games, scored more goals, conceded fewer goals than anybody else in the league and still finished in second place as a result of losing more games than Rathkenny Rovers. We needed to win one of our last two games to be crowned champions but could only manage one draw. Unfortunately we were short 4 players for our last game of the league - 3 through injury and one out of the country - which proved crucial in our 1 - 1 draw with Navan Cosmos. But we can't use that as an excuse as the League is won over 22 games and not one - so we must congratulate Rathkenny on their League win and look forward to playing them in Div. 1 next season.

This was the first season for the club to enter a team

in the Reserve League. Our second team did the club proud and fared very well in all 4 competitions in which they played. They finished top of their League - Premier Group C - but again unfortunately ended up with no silverware. As stated before the reserve leagues are decided by a play-off involving the top 3 teams in the Table. Tara played Blackwater Utd. in the final and the match ended in a one all draw after extra time and was then decided on penalties. It seems a pity that the whole season should be decided on five penalty kicks - but those are the rules and again we had to be happy with runner-up spot. A very successful day was had by our athletes on day 2 of the Meath Championships with everyone giving their best on the day. Three of our athletes won gold.

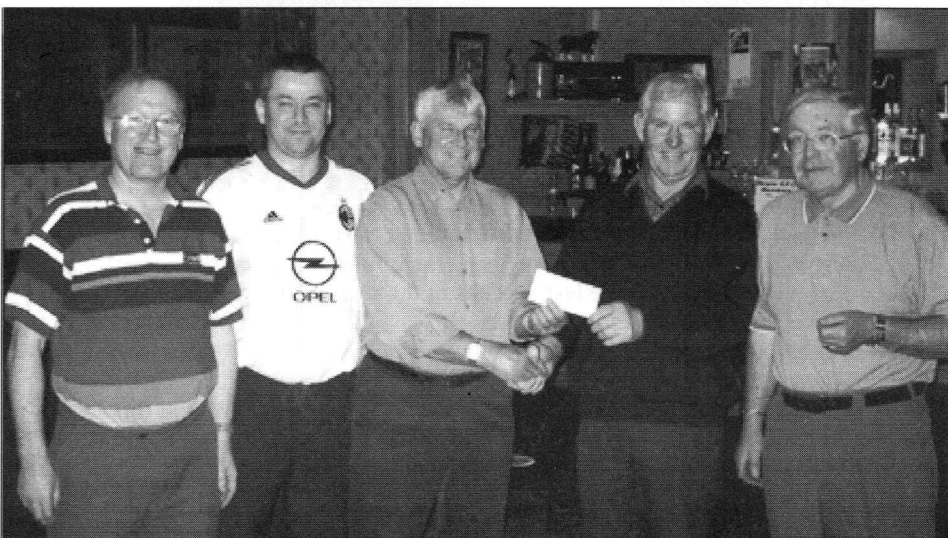
