
## GET WELL WISHES....

## OVER 1000 SAW GAME AT BOHERMEEN

### SKRYNE WON JUVENILE

An unsatisfactory finish and the performance of 'Blondie' Joe Doran were the two features of the Meath Juvenile football championship final played at Bohermeen on Friday night.

The big crowd (over 1000 patronised the game) enjoyed a really god game in which both teams were level up to the closing stages. Skryne got a 'soft' goal in the dying few minutes – in fact practically with the last kick of the ball and so Enfield were denied the chance of a replay.

### Deserved Win

However Skryne deserved their win. It was unfortunate however that Brennan in the Enfield goal slipped when attempting to save Mulvany's shot which proved to be the winning score. A draw might have been a better result. It could have happened the other way round.

### Man of the Match

The man of the match was undoubtedly little Joe Doran, Enfields utility man. At full back his lack of height was by no means a handicap. He held his own more than well and it was due to him that Skryne were kept at bay so well. When he moved to the forwards Joe was still at home, so much so that he notched three very useful points in a row. He was the hero of the game and fully deserved the special attention accorded to him at the end by the large crowd.

### Well Trained

The victors were trained by Mr. Packy Mooney a

former well known hurler and footballer and he must have felt proud of his charges. He did a really good job which paid dividends.

After the game the cup was presented to the Captain, Colm O'Brien, brother of Paddy O'Brien of the Meath Senior Team, by Mr. William Egleston, Chairman of the Juvenile Board.
