RATHFEIGH CHOIR SUPPORT LOCAL CHARITIES

Skryne Tara Knights 4 - 4 Parkvilla

Skryne Tara Knights Under 8s signalled their intent for MDL glory when the December tournament is decided. Managers Tony Carolan and James Murphy asked their players to "up their game" over the Halloween and all players produced their best performances to date. They put two impressive displays back to back when drawing with league leaders Parkvilla and earlier with Kingscourt 2-2.

Skryne Tara forced the pace in the first half and were rewarded with an early goal. The ball was crossed from the right and Padraig Finnerty first timed a low shot into the right corner, sending the goalie the wrong way.

Jason Reddy was teed up by a perfectly floated pass and he struck it first time from the half way line to score a spectacular equaliser. (Jason had already converted his team's two penalties against Kingscourt

earlier in the evening).

Skryne Tara were well served by both goalies on the night, Michael Carolan and Jamie Murphy who both brought off many fine saves. Andrew Moore and James Finnerty were solid as rocks in defence.
