## LIAM TOLAN - AN APPRECIATION



The parish of Skryne was rocked by the news of the untimely death of Liam Tolan on the morning of Sunday 23rd May 2010. A rising young star, Liam, at 17 years of age, had already made a name for himself within GAA circles as an extremely talented player.

His football career started in Rathfeigh N.S. where he guickly became a star and won a Primary Schools Final at a very young age. From Rathfeigh Liam went to Ashbourne Community School and made an immediate impact there in all sports activities. On the football field he was rewarded with

his place on the school team and eventually on the Meath VEC Ní bheidh a leithéid ann arís, ar dheis Dé go raibh a anim. county team. Between school and county. Liam has five Leinster medals - not bad for a 17 year old student. He was named 'player Skryne GFC of the year' in Ashbourne Community School for 2010.

As a member of the Skryne club, Liam played in all under age grades and in 2004 he played in the Under 12, 13 and 14 Finals winning the Under 12 Division 3 Championship and the Under 14 League. He was on the losing side in the Under 13 Final and also the Under 14 Championship Final. Therefore, Liam as a 12 year old played in four finals, winning two and losing two in the same year and helped Skryne to their first U-16 division 1 championship in 33 years in 2007, where he was top scorer with 1-5. Liam had also represented Skryne on the Meath Minor panel for the past two years. These were just a few of the vast amount of honours Liam had amassed in his all too short football career. A minute silence was held in his honour before the opening Senior Leinster Football Championship clash between Meath and Offaly in Portlaoise, where stunned supporters heard the

news of the tragic death of Liam, only hours after he had represented Meath Minor Footballers in their championship game, also against Offaly, the previous evening, in Pairc Tailteann.

All Skryne GFC activities were cancelled as a mark of respect until after the funeral. The esteem in which Liam was held can be gauged by the massive number of people from all over Meath and indeed further afield, who called to the Tolan family household before the funeral and attended church and graveyard on the day. The president of the GAA Mr. Christy Cooney arrived at Liam's house to offer his condolences to the family.

For years to come in the parish of Skryne and further afield, the name Liam Tolan will always pop up in conversation as one of the greatest young talents who never got the opportunity to reach his potential, he will always be remembered.

Once again we offer sincere sympathy to Liam's mother Theresa, father Alfie and brother Peter.

The Meath Field Names Project has started in the RST area. We have a number of volunteers in the Rathfeigh zone working in the townlands of Loughanstown, Bellew, Edoxtown, Macetown, Jealoustown (better known as Greenpark), and The Riggins. The work is enjoyable and particularly sociable. The interest in the local history of the the parish is amazing and we are fortunate to have such a rich heritage. Landowners love to talk about their fields, they appreciate very much that the "old" names are being recorded and in some cases they have christened fields that were nameless. We would like to thank the people we have visited so far for their co-operation and support as without your help it could not be done.

There are about 30 townlands in the Skryne grid, each one unique. These townlands vary in shapes and sizes and in the number of fields they contain. We have estimated that there are over 2,500 fields in our grid. The "harvest" is therefore great and we are inviting more volunteers to come on board, particularly in the Skryne side of the parish. #### Skryne U16's win Bobby **Pentony Tournament In Style**

Skryne's u16's won the Bobby Pentony Tournament against Duleek on Friday night in an amazing game of football where they came from eight points down to stage a dramatic second half comeback to lift the trophy.

The tournament was an invitational tournament for a number of local teams organised by Duleek GFC to remember a young Duleek player Bobby Pentony who had died 20 years ago at age 15, and a minute's silence was observed at the start of the game as a mark of respect to both Bobby Pentony and Skryne's Liam Tolan.

Right from the start Skryne were in trouble as a shot that looked to be sailing harmlessly wide caught the inside of the upright in the top corner to give Skryne's goalkeeper Luke Quinlan no chance.

Skryne lead by Tony Kennedy and Harry Rooney battled to win possession and with Donie Ryan and Niall Lenehan getting control of their areas Skryne started to put together a number of useful attacks that lead to a few memorable scores including a point from Steven Rathborne and Neil's Burke quick reaction to ensure his penalty rebound from the goalkeeper ended up in the back of the net to keep Skrvne in touch.

felt that Skryne were still in the game as they had missed a number of scoring opportunities and Luke Quinlan was unlucky in goals as he had brilliantly saved a goal bound shot at full stretch under the crossbar only to see an in rushing forward react quickest to knock the ball into the net.

Skrvne went further behind shortly after the restart when David O'Brien who was the Skryne goalkeeper for the second half made a great catch but was blocked down in attempting to clear the ball as the alert Duleek forwards pounced to ensure the ball ended up in the net.

Turning point of the game came a few minutes later when David pulled off the save of the game as a Duleek forward through on goals saw what would have been the match winner brilliantly saved by the Skryne keeper who then bravely dived on the rebound at the feet of the in rushing forward to secure possession for Skrvne.

The save lifted the whole team and bodies were put on the line all over the pitch as the backs Padraic Murphy, Donie Ryan, Emmet Jordan, David Byrne, Garreth O'Brien and Cian Lynch suddenly tightened up on their men and mid field started to get on the ball and feed it into the mobile forward line. Skryne players were now first to every ball or contesting strongly every breaking ball. Players like Harry Rooney, Tony Kennedy, Conor Whelan and Niall Lenehan grew in stature as the game progressed as they started to dominate the mid field area.

Up front the forward line of Steven Rathbourne, Stephen O'Brien, Josh Finnegan, Conor O'Brien, Neil Burke were dragging their Duleek markers all over the place, creating spaces and taking the opportunities that came their way.

Goals were coming from all quarters with superb goal strikes from Conor O'Brien, Stephen Rathborne, Conor Whelan, Tony Kennedy, one better than the next. As each goal went in the supporters began to get behind the team as they witnessed one of the best comebacks by a Skryne underage team. When Skryne's u16 joint captains Oisin Coyle and Niall Lenihan lifted the Bobby Pentony cup the whole u16 Squad & mentors At half time Duleek lead by 6 points but you experienced that special feeling that comes

with winning a final in a team sport.

Mentors Mick O'Dowd and Shane O'Brien were understandably thrilled with the manner of their team's victory and the effort put in by the whole squad.

Niall Lenehan in his captain's speech paid tribute to the Duleek GFC for a great tournament and the Duleek u16 team for their part in what was a great final. He thanked mentors Mick O'Dowd and Shane O'Brien for the work they had put in and dedicated the win to Liam Tolan a player that some of the U16 squad had the privilege to play with in recent years.

The smiles on the faces of proud parents and Skryne supporters showed how special this win was.

As the referee blew the final whistle the cheer that went up from the large Skryne contingent was heard back in Skryne as their team won one of the best underage finals held in Pairc Tailteann by a single point.

Skryne could have been further in front at half time and were unlucky not to have a second goal when Jason Reddy saw his brilliant goal bound effort hit the upright and stay out.

When Darren Fox went through for his second goal the roar that went up nearly lifted the roof off Pairc Tailteann.

When ace free taker, Jason Reddy pushed Skryne into the lead by a single point the game was set up for a tense few minutes until the final whistle.

Skryne points were all as as result of the excellent movement from the Skryne forwards Paddy Carpenter, David Carroll, Colm McLoughlin and Frank Carty which made space for Skryne's sharp shooters on the night Darren Fox (2-1), Jason Reddy (0-6) and Elizabeth Morland (0-1) who was causing the Donaghmore/Ashbourne backs all kinds of trouble every time she got on the ball but who also scored a magnificent point from play. Michael Doherty had a superb game at full back fielding everything that was dropped into the square. Colm Craige and Andrew Moore and half backs Robbie Clarke, James Finnerty and Daniel Fitzpatrick were tightly marking their men and fighting for every ball. Fiachra Finnegan was rock solid in goals and his clever kick outs to free Skryne half backs and midfield helped to launch Skryne attacks. Skryne's midfielder Eoin Smyth seemed to be



everywhere, constantly on the ball twisting and turning and setting up attack after attack. His equally hard working midfield partner, Dean Reddy contested every ball and kick-out winning more than his fair share. Mentors James Reddy, Declan Smyth, David Reddy, Johnny Quinn must take great credit for the work they have put in with this young squad over the last couple of years. They have trained and worked with these players developing their skills and team work. Anyone who has watched this side through the league campaign will have noticed the improvement in skill levels of all the U12 squad and be impressed with the way they have played as a team to deservedly win the league title.

The whole Skryne U12 squad were togged out and experienced the atmosphere of the build up to a final, running out and playing in Pairc Tailteann in front of a large crowd and to come back from Pairc Tailteann to a party in Skryne school as winners is a memory they will cherish.
