The Tuesday Club at Farmleigh House

The RST Tuesday Club's most recent trip was to Farmleigh House in the Phoenix Park. Farmleigh House was purchased by the Government in 1999 for €29 m. and since then refurbished by the OPW for €23m. It accommodates visiting dignitaries and guests of the nation and is also used for important Government meetings. It was purchased by Edward Cecil Guinness (1847-1927) on his marriage to his cousin Adelaide Guinness in 1873. This was a very prolific union which produced 21 children, 10 of whom survived. Edward was the great-grandson of Arthur Guinness , founder of the brewery that bears his name.

Our guided tour began in the dining room – a room lined with decorative wood carved panels of French influence and with a number of embroidered panels of Spanish origin depicting gods, Jupiter, Venus and Saturn. The table in the dining room was set for dinner as it was in Edward's time but the Tuesday Club were only allowed stand and admire the fine bone china and the silver service. Maybe the next time!

Tapestries of Dutch origin lined the long corridor depicting rural scenes while a Waterford glass chandelier dangled overhead. We were very impressed by the rich decoration of the ballroom from walls, ceiling, and chimney piece to the gilt metal chandelier in the centre. The library contains thousands of rare books and manuscripts of great historical significance. The collection has recently been donated to Marsh's Library but continues to be held at Farmleigh. Our guided tour finished in the conservatory which quite naturally didn't look its best in December. Structurally, it looks sound but would be far more impressive in the spring. Finally in the Boathouse Café overlooking the ornamental lake, high quality food was enjoyed by all in a relaxing setting. Where to next for the Tuesday Club?

Christmas Security Advice

One of the biggest concerns today for most people is if somebody breaks into their house. Jewellery and cash are the two main items stolen over the past number of months. Traditionally burglaries rise by approximately 25 per cent in winter with most occurring between 5pm and 11pm.

Where burglaries are concerned the most common points of entry by burglars are front door (29 per cent), rear window (26 per cent), rear door (22 per cent) and 20 per cent of burglaries take place through an unsecured door or window. It is important to take steps to protect your property with the evenings getting longer. It is advisable for everybody to remain vigilant and security conscious in order to thwart burglars. The longer evenings can help burglars spot if people are not home. Traditionally thieves love Christmas time as it opens up lots of opportunities for them. People are busy preparing for the Christmas period and sometime forget about basic security. Un-occupied houses are easily identified by criminals when there are no lights left on, curtains left open or no cars in the driveway. I would recommend that you to follow a number of basic steps to increase your home security over the festive season:

- Secure all doors and windows with guality locks.
- Make sure all outside lights are working and use timer switches on lights for when you are out.
- Store car keys safely away from windows and letterboxes.
- Record details of valuables and don't keep large cash amounts at home.
- Use your alarm, even when you are at home.
- Leave a number of empty wrapped Christmas boxes under the tree and hide more expensive presents until ready to give to family members.
- Be careful when you light candles; make sure they are not near any tree or decorations.

Here are a few more tips to help make your Christmas a safe and enjoyable one.

- When out shopping do not leave valuable on view in cars which are unattended.
- Mind your wallets and purses when shopping or out socialising.
- DO NOT DRINK AND DRIVE.
- Stay together after a night socialising. Don't leave anybody behind.
- Use hi-vis jackets or lights when out on the roads.
- If weather changes for the worse make sure you plan any journey well in advance.
- Keep an eye on elderly neighbours and friends.

A new concept around the county is the increased number of text alert groups being set up. Skyrne Community Alerts has a Text Alert in operation which was started earlier in the year.
