Meath on the other hand were the new kids on the block full of potential and promise. This was a whole new experience with a mighty challenge. The question was could they deliver on the big occasion. We were soon gonna find out. Belief has to be cultivated over time and the initial 5 game winning streak had brought home a county title. Belief was further enhanced in the 3 games on the Leinster sojourn with victories over Longford Westmeath and Kildare. Belief was at an all time high but now we were meeting champions who also were realising that same self belief. The clock struck 10 and our troops were summoned to enter the lions den. The team signed in and registered and got a brisk 10 minute warm up and final pep talk. Suddenly the first semi final was over and now it was our game. The fans from Skryne gave a huge lift to the team as they ran out onto the sparkling shiny indoor arena.

The Limerick roar erupted, the sound was deafening. The Skryne Girls settled into their task as if nothing had happened. They had their own game plan and started to impose it. They were rewarded after 5 minutes when Megan Clarke shook off a defender, made space for a shot and drove hard and low for the equaliser. The inspired Ciara Smyth put the Skryne Girls ahead just before half time with a perfectly placed shot from out on the right to make it 2-1 at the break.

Askeaton got off to another serendipitous start when they unleashed

a thunderbolt shot from the kick off which squeezed through the keepers hands to just about cross the line. It was a second sucker punch goal. It was 2-2.
