Meet the Active First Responders





On May 8th 2014, we held a public meeting in the RST Centre in Skryne which was well-attended and showed there was a keen interest in the Parish to either

support or be part of this life-saving scheme. Only seven months later, after a lot of very hard work and extremely generous donations from the parishioners, we could finally fund our training programmes and medical equipment, and thus our dream was realised. We went live on December 15th so whilst you may not have been aware of this, we were on-call throughout the Festive Season.

Our area covers Rathfeigh, Skryne and Tara. On notification from the National Ambulance Service, we are dispatched to the location of the emergency to aid the patient before the ambulance arrives. This is crucial in the case of cardiac arrest where CPR must be started as quickly as possible and a defibrillator is vital. Disturbingly, with each minute lost, the chance of survival reduces by a further 10%. It can be difficult to judge a medical situation, not, we're actually a nice bunch too!) so our advice is: If in doubt, call 999 / 112. Our training covers: suspected Heart Attack, Cardiac Arrest, Stroke and Choking. The programme includes an intensive one-

day course, concentrating on CPR (life-saving compressions) and use of a defibrillator, how to assess chest pain, signs of stroke and what to do if a person is choking.

This is followed up by 'scenario training'

where the new recruits are sent out to 'calls' in the parish simulating all scenarios likely to be encountered whilst on duty. We can all be very prepared in theory, but the reality is often guite different when we are out of our comfort zone. The consensus from all our volunteers has been unanimous – it is very different to learning in a classroom and therefore extremely helpful. There is now a monthly refresher evening (either in the RST Centre in Skryne or St. Patrick's Hall in Dunshaughlin) on the first Wednesday of each month (from 8pm-9.30pm) to keep the skillslearned up to standard.

Whilst we have a lot of active volunteers in the Dunshaughlin area, we desperately need new members in this parish. The more people who are trained, the easier it will be to cover this huge area.

If you are interested in being a First Responder but not quite sure about it, you are more than welcome to come along and see how it works (contact details below). We can all learn something worthwhile here, and it isn't as difficult as you might think. (Believe it or Last but not least, we would sincerely like to thank the RST Committee who has provided the Centre for training purposes and meetings since our foundation – we are forever grateful!!

Marguerite O'Connell Gleeson



There was widespread sadness following the passing on 12th February last of Marguerite Gleeson, of O'Connell's Public House on the Hill of Skryne, whose death came as a shock to many. Marguerite had taken over the running of the

landmark public house from her mother, Mary O'Connell, following her passing just two and a half years ago.

The establishment is famous for appearing on the Guinness television advertisement for the past decade, and always attracted tourists, visitors as well as the 'county set', with local hunts often meeting on the hill. A number of movies were also shot on location at the pub.

Marguerite, whose home was in Richmond Avenue, Monkstown, Dublin, died at St Vincent's Private Hospital, Dublin. She married George Gleeson, a Limerick native, in 1984, the same year her father, James, passed away.

Remembered as somebody with a get up and go attitude with a zest for life, she was a great fundraiser for the Hope Foundation, which looked after street and slum children in Kolcata (Calcutta), India, where she visited twice. She later turned her attentions to Focus Ireland, and initiated a novelty cake bake by men competition in the pub as a fundraiser for the homeless organisation. She loved travel and in San Francisco, bumped into one of the pub customers at the Fisherman's Wharf.

Marguerite had been diagnosed with cancer eight years ago, but carried on regardless, never letting it get in the way of daily life. Given four to five years at the time, she lived for eight, but sadly saw both her brother, Tom, and mother, Mary, pass away over the past three and a half years. She is survived by her husband, George, relatives, friends and customers. The funeral took place from St Colmcille's Church, Skryne to the family plot at the Hill of Skryne Cemetery.
