

# **Tara Athletic Club on the rise!**

2016 proved to be a very successful year for Tara Athletic Club with athletes returning three All Ireland medals, numerous Meath and Leinster Track and Field and Cross Country medals and winning the title of Meath Cross Country League winners in 2016. The success is due to a huge amount of hard work on the part of over 20 coaching staff, as well as the support of parents and dedication of athletes. However the club would also like to sincerely thank the community of Skryne and Rathfeigh who have supported the fundraising efforts of the club in recent years, through the 'Strictly Come Dancing' event, the 5k Road Race and Church Gate Collections, which has enabled us to upgrade the facilities at the track at Ross Cross, allowing the club to flourish. This edition gives a short summary of the achievements of the club last year.

#### **All Ireland Medals**

Tara AC returned three All Ireland medals in 2016. The first was rising star Seanie Dalton winning an All-Ireland medal in the Irish Secondary Schools Cross Country in the Minor Boys race finishing in 6th position which was a fantastic individual achievement. In July 2016, a great Bronze medal in the All Ireland Pairs Boys Under-9 competition over 300M was won by Ruby Beggan and Conor Giles in Tullamore.

#### Meath Cross Country league 2016

The pinnacle of the team effort from the club was the winning of the Cross Country league title. This involved a huge effort from every one of the 49 athletes who performed consistently over three legs in Navan Racecourse, Enfield and the Porchfields in Trim in November and December 2016. There were three individual winners from Tara Ac being Ruby Beggan under 9 boys, Megan Clarke under 13 girls and Seanie Dalton under 15 boys. This was a consistent, strong club performance which also saw top three placings from Conor Giles and Sean Smyth, who were second and third respectively in the under 9 boys, and Jake Cullen who was second in the under 15 boys and every single other athlete scored points for club finishing top 20.

# Meath and Leinster Track and Field and Relay Championships May 2016

In the Meath Championships, there were medals for Eoghan Conway (triple jump), Paul Byrne Kelly and Billy Smyth (High Jump), Rose Beggan, Caoimhe Giles and James Reeves and Conor Giles (Long Jump), Seanie Dalton, Jake Cullen, Sean Byrne, Jarlath Jordan in the track events. In the Meath Relays, Tara AC had medals in the under 9 boys, under 11 girls and under 16 boys.

In Tullamore at the Leinster Championships, congratulations to Jarlath Jordan who was second in the 3000m steeplechase and Sean Byrne won a bronze in the 110m hurdles. Sean and Jarlath also put in fantastic performances at the All Ireland Track and Field Championships under 18 years also in Tullamore. Jarlath ran a great race in the 3000M steeplechase final to finish 4th and Sean put in a storming run in the 400M Hurdles final to finish a very commendable 4th place. Sean also qualified from the Leinster Championships in the High Jump and finished 7th overall in this event.

#### Meath Community Games Cross Country

There was a great turnout from Skryne and Tara AC for the Meath Community Games Cross Country in a sunny Ballinacree on 27th Feb 2016. Winners were Caoimhe Giles under 10 and Seanie Dalton under 14 with top three positions from Sean Smyth Under 8, Niamh McGuinness under 9, Conor Giles and Ruby Beggan under 9, Amy O'Dowd under 14 and Ciara Smyth under 12 and a fantastic 4th place medal for Kate Gibbons under 10.

#### Meath Cross Country c/ships 2016

Tara AC had some fantastic performances in the 'even ages' championships in Ashbourne in October 2016 with individual top three medals for Niamh Mc Guinness under 10, Seanie Dalton under 16 and Jarlath Jordan under 18. Tara also claimed a record number of team medals with under 10 Girls taking the bronze, under 12 boys the silver , under 14 girls the bronze, and the under 16 and under 18 boys both taking the gold. Also making the Meath team for the Leinster championships with top 12 spots were Dylan Murphy under 12, Jake Cullen under 16 as well as Kadir Guirey, Matthew, Sean Byrne and David Hawes. Tara Ac had 41 athletes who competed brilliantly in the 'uneven ages' championships in Athboy with two teams winning the gold medal, the under nine boys and under 15 boys. The under 13 girls and the under 17 boys each won the bronze team medal.

#### Meath Cross Country Relay C/ships 2016

A massive team effort saw a record haul of relay medals for Tara AC in a very cold afternoon in Dunboyne. Tara AC had 13 teams running with over 50 athletes which is a club record. We had medals in 6 of the 8 age categories with under ten boys silver and girls bronze, under 12 boys bronze, under 14 girls and boys bronze, under 16 boys gold.

#### **Adult Section**

Well done to our Tara AC Men's Team of Andrew Murphy, James Murphy, James Gibbons, Paul O'Donnell, Vincent Naughton, Brian Smyth, Shane Moss and Johnny Quinn who won the silver team medal in the Men's Senior Cross Country Championships Grade B in Trim on 18th December 2016. Onwards and upwards for these lads!

Tara AC also presented a a cheque to the Soup Kitchen Navan after our fun 'Run-Ride-Run' charity event in November 2016. Participants ran 5k, cycled 8k and ran a further 3k. Winner of the men's section was juvenile coach Andrew Murphy and the ladies section winner was club member Paula Geraghty. Well done to all who took part and raised funds for this worthy charity.

Tara Athletic Club hosted a very successful 5K Road Race and 3K Juvenile run on Friday 26th August with a huge turnout of over 290 athletes.

Finally we always welcome new members in Tara AC, but unfortunately, due to high numbers in the juvenile section, registration for juveniles is now closed for 2017, and will re-open in 2018. However, adults are still very welcome to join this year.

Skryne Rathfeigh held their first local gymnastics competition on Friday 10th March. Congratulations to all our gymnasts who took part.


