An excellent game of football played on a perfect pitch in ideal conditions resulted in victory for Skryne by 3 points in this A League Division 2 encounter. Castletown began the match much brighter than Skryne and had a goal and a point on the board in the first few minutes. Paddy Carpenter got the home team off the mark with a very well taken point and two more from Brian Davis seemed to settle Skryne but Castltown regrouped and their forwards had the Blues defence in all sorts of trouble all through this first half. They were never headed in this period and fully deserved their half time lead of 1-8 to 0-9 having played into the road end goals with little or no breeze to contend with.

The second half proved to be the opposite with Skryne on top right from the start and scored two goals and a point before Castletown had their first point eight minutes in. Mark Battersby and Patrick O'Rourke getting the Blues goals after some great work out the field with a number of players involved in both moves. Batts added three pointed frees before Castletown got back into the game and had the Skryne's lead back to two points with a minute of normal time left. Again the Blues finished strongly and Darragh Campion scored the last point of the game to seal victory for the home team.

This was a good team performance from Skryne with some very good individual displays particularly from Ian Gillett in goals - two brilliant saves kept his side in front in that helter skelter second half. Mark Jordan was back to his best and Mark Harrington got to grips with the dangerous Castletown full forward in the second half. The midfielders broke even while upfront Brian Davis and Patrick O'Rourke stood out, but overall every player played their part in an important victory which keeps Skryne in the top half of the League table.

On a bitterly cold but dry evening in McManus Park the concession of three goals in the first half put 'paid' to Skryne's chances of winning this B League Division 1 clash. It took a goal from Felim O'Rourke late in the half to give Skryne some sort of chance to peg back the Kells men's half time lead of 7 points - 3-4 to 1-3. The Gaels forwards had the Skryne defence in trouble right from the start and they had the ball in the net for the opening score of the game in the first minute. Skryne struggled in front of goal and a number of bad wides added to the problems at the other end of the field.

Kells began the second half as they had the first and they scored an early forty five to increase their lead to eight points. To be fair to the Skryne men they never gave up and gradually clawed their way back into the match despite the fact that they conceded another goal midway through this period. The Blues outscored the Gaels by 1-8 to 1-4 in this half but unfortunately their goal from substitute Sean Cassidy came with only a few minutes to go. They did have two more chances to level up the match but Kells had packed their defence and deservedly held out for a three point win.

In a difficult match for Skryne most players put in an enormous effort and no blame can be attached for the defeat to Des McAvinney in goals, or Mark Jordan, David Lynch and Michael Doherty further out the field.

They did score 13 times to the oppositions 12 but as said already 'goals win games'.

Skryne Community Alert - RST 19th April

Text Alert

Thanks to all that renewed your text alert subscriptions to date. We get regular crime updates from our Community Garda and he assures us that the operation of Text Alert in our area is playing a significant part in deterring criminals. We have now refreshed the Text Alert database with our service provider so if you have not renewed by now you will no longer receive alerts until you do. Don't worry – you can still renew at Tara PO, and Mary has some spare forms there. The cost to sign up or renew is just $\in 10$ for one phone, $\in 20$ for two etc. Don't forget to make a note of your eircode before completing the form – it can help us identify what areas are covered in the future.

Suspicious Activity

While Text Alert plays a significant role in deterring criminals, it is only one tool available to us. It is essential that each of us take responsibility as members of our community for reporting all suspicious activity in the area. We cannot all assume that somebody else will. We are part of the Ashbourne Garda District, and the number we should use to report suspicious activity is 01 801 0600. The Gardaí acknowledge that on occasion it may take more than one attempt to get through during busy periods, but please do persevere. Important details to report are type and colour of any vehicle involved, as well as the registration number and number of passengers. If you only get a glance at a registration plate, the most important part to remember is the county and number. Due to limited resources at the Garda stations, it is not possible for them to report back on the outcome of your call, but this is not an indication that the information has not been useful in preventing a crime or an aid to apprehending a criminal. The Gardaí may or may not generate a text alert based on your call. This decision is made on a case-by-case basis, depending on how useful a text would prove to the general community in that instance.

Raising a Cuppa at The RST Centre for Alzheimers

For the past 25 years, families of Alzheimers patients in Meath have been able to care for their loved ones at home for longer because of the excellent Day Care Centre at Whistlemount, Navan. This precious facility which means so much to so many families has to raise 40 per cent of it's operation costs each year through local fundraising. The main fundraiser is the Alzheimer's Tea Day which this year takes place nationally on Thursday May 4th.

The ladies of Skryne & Rathfeigh will host their **Annual Tea Day in the RST Centre** in the grounds of Skryne G.F.C. all day on Thursday May 4th from 9.30 am to 7pm and will also include garden plant sale by Brid Conroy which proved very popular last year. All money raised will go directly to the Navan Centre.

The Meath branch also runs an Alzheimers' Cafe once a month in the Dunshaughlin Pastoral Centre for patients and their families - it caters for patients in the earlier stages of the disease. The cafe hosts talks by occupational therapists and on legal matters and other issues of concern to patients.
