### **Tuesday Club Talk on Tara**

On Tuesday the 2nd May the audience in the RST were entertained and enthralled by an excellent presentation by Mr Michael Slevin, Tara. Michael has been living on the Hill in excess of 50 years and in that time he has become an expert on the history and mythology associated with the Hill and Michael gave us an overview of much of this. In his presentation Michael outlined with wonderful aerial photographs the extent and size of the relevant enclosures which made up the settlement and which many of us were unaware of the scale and size of the settlements. He emphasised the importance of the landscape to the first settlers and the extent of the panoramic view from the top of the Hill where it is claimed features of 16 counties can be observed, He himself can only name 13 and he is still waiting for someone to identify the other three. He outlined briefly the long line of High Kings associated with Tara, in excess of 140 are named, the best known to us being Niall of the Nine Hostages and Cormac MacAirt, and of course the Kings of Ulster the O'Neills who also ruled Tara

Also very closely associated with Tara is our Patron Saint, Patrick and his coming to Tara in 433 to explain Christianity to the Druids or High priests of Tara, with the obvious success of his visit. Associated with the visit is one of the enclosures, the Rath of the Synod which was named after a conclave to integrate Christianity with the Breton Laws.

He did however strongly emphasise that the History of Tara was only first recorded in writing about the 7th or 8th century and up till then all the mythology and legends associated with the Hill and its residence was passed down through generations by the spoken word. It is only fair to assume the consequently many were embellished to make them more receptive to the listener.

He also included briefly the killing of over 450 men of the 1798 rebellion.

All in all Michaels presentation made us all realise how lucky we are to be living in an area around which so much of our heritage and culture is based.

An excellent evening and many thanks to Michael.

# Stephen Kelly Rip (An Appreciation)

The death occurred recently of Stephen Kelly, affectionately known as 'Spider', after a well known Wexford footballer of the 1950's. He was a footballer himself of more than ordinary merit and played senior for Skryne for more than ten years. He first came to prominence in 1959 when Skryne reached the Final of the Junior B Football Championship and although beaten by Longwood Stephen had a fine game at corner forward, getting on the scoresheet. He then made his way on to the Skryne Senior team and played in many Tournament wins - competitions that were very popular at that time.

Stephen won a Junior B League medal in 1964 in a competition that started almost three years previously. (That would never happen now).

The following year 1965 was a very successful one for Stephen and Skryne as the Blues won all before them. By now Stephen was an established goalkeeper and starred in the Feis Cup Final win over Colmcille Gaels, Kells. He was also a valued member of the team that famously won the Keegan Cup that same year.

Stephen was interested in all sports and loved nothing better than a day at the races - both horses and greyhounds. He also took part in clay pigeon shooting and was involved competitively right up to the time he became indisposed.

In his professional life he had a great love of the land and farmed his own farm at Oberstown. He also gained employment with the Gallagher Group (Building Company) and became an integral part of that organisation as their Farm Manager in Hollystown on the Meath Dublin border.

Stephen was laid to Rest in Rathfeigh and at the funeral his coffin was draped in the famous blue and white jersey of the Skryne club.

We offer sincere sympathy to his only surviving family member his sister, Brigid. Ar Dheis Dé go raibh a anam.

### **Skryne Community Alert**

Now the longer evenings have arrived, many of us are spending more time in the gardens and enjoying the sunshine. It's easy to let our guard down, so here are a few crime prevention tips to keep in mind at this time of year:

- If you are sitting out or working in your back garden, make sure your front door is locked and windows closed. Keeping your gate closed is also a good deterrent.
- Take photos and note serial numbers of mowers or other garden machinery used at this time of year. Don't leave them unattended on your lawn or on your driveway.
- Mark garden machinery and tools with your Eircode. This can help deter theft and aid recovery of stolen items.
- If you hear your front doorbell ring, make sure your back door is locked before you go to open your front door. Distraction is a common technique used by burglars looking for cash and jewellery. They know from experience where to look, and they can be in and back out again during the time that you are at the front door.
- Keep an eye on your neighbour's property. If you have elderly or vulnerable neighbours, it is worth checking if any work taking place on their house (guttering, roofing, driveway surfacing etc) has been authorised. It is not unknown for rogue traders to start unauthorised work on a house, and then demand payment from the vulnerable owner. It is good practice to never employ the services of people calling door to door offering discounts on house maintenance. Instead note their car/van registration number and notify the Gardai on 01 801 0600.
- Above all please remain vigilant. Report all suspicious activity to the gardai 01 801 0600. Save the number on your phone.

### **Disappointing Finish To Very Successful Season**

Skryne Tara's first season in the AUL (Athletic Union League) came to an end this evening (Thursday) with a very impressive 5-0 home win over the League Champions Cabra Celtic in the final game of the season. This result meant they finished Runners-Up to Cabra, 3 points behind them, after 24 games in a 13 team League programme. It also meant SKRYNE Tara had beaten every team in the League at least once.

Ironically, Skryne Tara lost just one match in this mammoth League, a 1-0 defeat at the hands of Dingle United (also from Cabra) at Ross Cross. Maybe they had underestimated Dingle as they had beaten them 4-1 in the away fixture in Cabra. Unfortunately, Skryne Tara lost one match in the Boardroom after a Referee 'rescinded' a red card and then changed his mind when the club fielded the same player the following week. All this leaves a sour taste considering they lost those 3 points in the Boardroom, even though they won that game 4-1, while their closest rivals and eventual champions, Cabra Celtic, actually gained 4 points in the same Boardroom. Cabra drew two matches during the season but on objection won both which meant a swing of seven points overall. Skryne Tara losing 3, Cabra Celtic gaining 4. Cabra won the League by 3 points. (See League table). Having said all that, it was a very successful first season in the AUL and if you offered those results at the beginning last September, including reaching the semi-final of the prestigious Leinster

Junior Shield, the lads might have been happy to accept it. Add in reaching the semi-finals of the Frank Roe Cup and the Unidare Cup in a packed season meant the team was competitive from start to finish. No wonder they were voted 'team of the month' for February.
