

Skryne Tara Reach Leinster Final

Successful Season Continues to Reach New Heights

Skryne Tara AFC have reached the Final of the Leinster Junior Shield for the first time.

Last year the lads reached the semi-final of this Competition which is one of the most prestigious in Junior football. In that semifinal they were defeated 1-0 by the eventual winners Straffan United from the Kildare League. This term the team were determined to go one better and have now done so by reaching the final where they will be up against another Meath based club -Ashbourne United. In a competition that began with over one hundred and thirty teams from all over Leinster is now down to just two - both from County Meath but neither playing their football in a Meath League. Ashbourne United play in the Junior section of the Leinster Senior League while Skryne Tara play in the Athletic Union League in Dublin. Skryne Tara have made a number of journeys to Wexford over the last two years so it was no surprise when they once again drew opposition from that League in this years semi-final. Shelbourne United (not to be confused with the Dublin senior club Shelbourne FC) were our opponents in that last four game and so a bus trip to New Ross was undertaken once again. A long day was made very worthwhile with a well deserved 3-1 win over a physically strong Shelbourne United side. Now the Final is fixed for Saturday 11th April in United Park, Drogheda, and all the players are looking forward to the experience of playing on a League of Ireland ground for the first time. Let's hope they can make it a day to remember and make history for one of the youngest and smallest clubs in the competition. As both team's colours are yellow a draw was made, in the FAI Headquarters in Abbottstown recently, for the right to play in their usual home jerseys. Skryne Tara won that draw and will play in their normal yellow and blue strip. They will also have the use of the 'Home' changing room in United Park.

On their way to the Final Skryne Tara have played six knockout matches - 1st Round - Skryne Tara 6 Shankill (LSL) 1 at Ross Cross2nd Round - All Blacks (Wexford) 0 Skryne Tara 1 in Wexford Town.3rd Round - Duncannon (Wexford) 0 Skryne Tara 2 in Duncannon4th Round - Skryne Tara 2 Wayside Celtic (LSL) 1 at Ross CrossQuarter Final - Skryne Tara 4 SCV (LSL/AUL) 1 at Ross CrossSemi-Final - Shelbourne United (Wexford) 1 Skryne Tara 3 in New RossFinal - Skryne Tara v Ashbourne United (LSL) United Park Drogheda.

Skryne Tara are also flying high in the AUL Div 3 League and are 4 points clear of second placed Beggsboro FC with seven games left. They have 34 points from their 13 games played so far. The club are still in the Challenge Cup and the Quarter Final of the Unidare Cup. So doing well in four competitions a big squad is necessary and the joint managers Robbie Thorpe and Cyril Carty are using all of the 23 players to great effect which can be a difficult task at the best of times.



Skryne Community Alert

COVID-19 and the community

The corona virus has arrived in Ireland, and while there is currently no vaccine or treatment for the virus, we must each take responsibility to limit it's spread to vulnerable members of our community. 80% of us will have mild or no symptoms, but it is up to all of us to protect the other 20%.



Most vulnerable are those over 60 years old, and those with long term medical conditions such as heart disease, lung disease, diabetes, cancer or high blood pressure. The following are the recommendations from the HSE to help prevent the spread of the virus:

Do

- ✓ Wash your hands properly and often
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve when you cough and sneeze.
- Put used tissues into a bin and wash your hands.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Avoid close contact with people who are not well.
- ✓ Follow the travel advice from the Department of Foreign Affairs
- Stay at home if you are sick to help stop the spread of whatever infection you may have

Do Not

- X Do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean.
- Do not share objects that touch your mouth for example, bottles, cups

The advice can change as more is learned about the virus. You will find the latest information at www2.hse.ie/conditions/coronavirus.

If you have a vulnerable neighbour, it would be a good idea to keep in touch and see if they need anything. But don't call around in person if you have any symptoms or think you may have been exposed to the virus.

ALONE have launched a helpline for older people who have concerns or are facing difficulties relating to the outbreak of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) in Ireland, in collaboration with the HSE and the Department of Health.

The Skryne Brooch

Some years ago, I highlighted the existence of the Skryne Brooch and asked why it wasn't back in Ireland where it belongs. On a recent visit to the British Museum in London, I was delighted to see it on display again in Room 41 in the "Celtic Britain and Ireland Section, AD 300-1100." Its name is not mentioned but a caption underneath tells us that the brooch was found in "Tara, 1893."

After 127 years, wouldn't it be lovely if it came home, even for a visit! However, when I approached the National Museum in Dublin, I was told that they had "neither plans nor reasons" to borrow it from London. They said that there were hundreds of artefacts in British Museums that originated in Ireland during colonial days. I rest my case for now!.
